Principal's Message

I would like to extend a huge **WELCOME** to the 2020 school year to all our existing parents and carers and to all the lovely families who have joined our wonderful community this year. It is very exciting to be back and the year ahead promises to be rich and rewarding. Staff have already undertaken extensive training in the teaching of spelling (last week) and we will all be undertaking a certified course through the University of New South Wales in supporting the learning of students with high potential (beginning next term). Amazing work and we have only just begun!! I would like to sincerely welcome our new and very talented members of staff who have joined us this year. Thank you for joining our school Mr Alec Hanson in Kindergarten, Mrs Karen Grant in Year 3 (Mrs Kelly had baby *Leo* 3 weeks ago) and Ms Gallie and Mrs Simpson in 2L (Mrs Leung is currently on leave). A shout out also to Mrs Marie Haines who delivered baby *Leonard*, just before New Year. Wonderful news for all. Ms Mary-Anne Madden has returned to us this year, and is working part-time supporting 1M with Mrs Samantha McDonald.

We are also very excited about all the structural changes around the school as they certainly give a more united feel to the school as it flows more easily between the two blocks. With the new access ramps in place, it is very exciting to see parents with prams now being able to access the office with ease. The new school entrance will also give us the opportunity to really showcase our garden. Suzy Bates and the Green Team members have already discussed some exciting plans for the garden so watch this space!

Our new official entry to the school will be in Dixon Street once the sign and electronic gates are installed. These gates operate with a two-way speaking/visual system to allow office staff to provide access in to the school. This will mean that between the hours of 9.15 and 2.50pm all gates are locked. It is very important that we support families and the children in our school for which there are genuine safety concerns. As a result, it is very important that all students are at school on time with supervision for students commencing from 8.30am. If a child is going to be late for school, an adult must accompany them to the Office through the Dixon Street entry. I know this is a change from last year so I, and the families concerned will greatly appreciate your support with this system.

There is also another couple of **changes in organisation** for this year. Firstly, weekly assemblies this year will be held on a Monday afternoon between 2.00 - 3.00pm commencing Monday 10^{th} February. Last year they were in the morning so we have moved it around to give parents who are available in the afternoon an opportunity to attend. Also, we will have a new canteen system this

year which will commence in Week 4. The P & C will be sending home a note very shortly, explaining the quick and easy way you will be able to order lunches for your child this year.

In addition, the P & C will be running a pre-loved uniform shop. Once all the alterations are complete, this shop will work out of a room in B Block. However, as it is the start of the year, it is important to give parents the opportunity now to acquire some larger sizes. I would like to greatly thank the wonderful Jade Grey for putting her hand up to coordinate and run this shop for us. Jade has offered to set up two tables of clothing under the Canteen COLA next Thursday (13 Feb) and Friday (14 Feb) between 8.30 and 9.30am. All items, hats included will sell for \$5.00 each. There will be no eftpos facilities so please bring cash with you. Please take advantage of this opportunity and support our school's Sustainability Philosophy of Make, Break, Take, Cake (see attached at the end of my report), with up-cycling unwanted clothing falling under the *Make* principle.



Every year we have Sports in Schools Australia (SISA) deliver expert programs to our students in Athletics and Gymnastics. These are outstanding programs and at Hamilton Public School we always endeavour to provide our students with the very best on offer. SISA employ specialists in these areas and provide amazing equipment for the

students to use, supported by expert coaching. Historically, all the students have really loved these programs and have achieved great skill development. This year, SISA will also be providing *Dance*, Wellbeing and Social Skills programs. They will develop student strategies in: Resilience, Sharing. Communication, Co-operation, Respect, Perseverance, Trusting, Problem Solving, Adaptability and Responsibility. This will be exciting learning and all the programs get students interacting in a fearfree setting. As has been done in previous years with Gymnastics and Athletics, the school will heavily subsidise the fees for parents with the cost reducing by over 50% to \$3.50/student/week. Please note there will be no whole school swimming lessons this year with swimming school being offered to only Kindergarten – Year 2 in Term 3. Information on School Fees will be sent home on Monday.

The United Nations has developed the **United Nations 17 Goals for Sustainability** to transform our world. The integrated units taught at our school, in every class K-6, are based on these United



























Nations goals. Different goals are covered each term child's your class newsletter, distributed at the beginning of each term, will indicate which goals are being covered explicitly. Through exploring the integrated units, students will develop problem solving skills, critical and creative thinking and have many opportunities to develop their

communication and collaboration skills. Each fortnight, at Monday's assembly, a different class will present information on their United Nations goal for that term. We also promote **Nature Play** at the school, which allows students to use imagination, be creative. cooperate with others and apply critical thinking as they build and construct using sticks, stones, rocks, leaf litter, pieces of wood, water, dirt and a variety of loose parts. It is amazing to see what they are able to construct when working cooperatively with each other. If you are concerned about your child getting dirty then you can send to school a play shirt with them to put over their clothes when playing. We have three playground rules, as demonstrated in the picture to the left, that are designed to empower students to think for themselves and make sensible choices about play activities. Please reinforce these reflective questions at home with your child.

It has been shown in multiple studies that exposure to natural elements for young people leads to an increase in attention span and focus, as well as reduced stress levels and increased physical and emotional wellbeing (Driessnack, 2009), as well as countless other benefits!

Children have an inborn inclination and interest in the natural environment and its elements. It makes them feel comfortable and appeals to the senses - we have an organic connection to nature that we often underestimate (Pelo, 2008).
