<u>LITERACY</u>

Our SMART Spelling program will continue, with aspects of Speech Sound Pics (SSP) introduced.

Comprehension skills will be explicitly taught and supported by the CARs online program, along with a variety of other resources, with an initial focus on drawing conclusions and making inferences, followed by summarising and author's purpose.

We will continue to work on imaginative writing, which will be followed by informative writing, based on geography outcomes, later in the term. Handwriting remains an ongoing focus, with pen licenses to be awarded throughout the remainder of the year.

Due to the disrupted nature of last term, we are continuing to work on our class novel, Wonder.

OVERNIGHT EXCURSION UPDATE

We are very aware of the uncertain times currently surrounding us during this pandemic, and we are extremely thankful for your help and support during recent times. Although we were proactive in pushing overnight excursions as far back into Term 4 as possible (hoping restrictions might ease) at this point these experiences are looking unlikely.
